Plenary Forum on the Effect of US Military Invasion of the Dominican Republic on Immigration from Hispaniola to USA.

Forum features a discussion of CUNY Graduate Center Scholar Nestor H. Montilla's research findings about the long-lasting socio-economic and political effects of US 1916 occupation of the Dominican Republic on immigration from Hispaniola to USA. A salient point of discussion centers on rebuking how US military's policies aimed at changing Dominican sexual and gender norms during the invasion of the Dominican Republic paved the way for the justification to control and deride Dominican women, and for the virtual institutionalization of rape, violence, sexual crimes and murder of Dominican women. This plenary includes a Q&A session / *Sesión Plenaria sobre los efectos de la invasión norteamericana a la Hispaniola. Este foro presenta los resultados del estudio de investigación del catedrático Néstor H. Montilla Sr. sobre los efectos socioeconómicos y políticos de la ocupación norteamericana del 1916 en la emigración de Hispaniola a USA. Se discutirá también la política implantada durante la invasión estadounidense para regular las normas sexuales y de género de los dominicanos y como esas políticas han resultado en detrimento de la mujer dominicana hasta el presente en lo que respecta a su control social, abusos y violaciones sexuales y asesinatos.
